Approval of Change Order and Project Acceptance

Dear Honorable Body:

Approval of the change order and project acceptance of the 2016 Storm Sewer Separation Project on Christiana Street is hereby requested. We have estimated that this project removed approximately 4 million gallons of stormwater annually from the city's sanitary sewer system. The change order represents the additional work required to install the storm sewer system as follows:

Horizontal conflicts/alignment change at Christiana/Vandervoort
 Total description of the Market City Hell Letters and City

\$10,860.70

Extend new sewer to separate Lincoln Avenue to City Hall Lot

\$29,863.34

\$40,724.04

Costs for extra work were measured and based on unit bid prices extant in the contract.

The extremely favorable bid of the project allowed the city to include the removal of stormwater from the sanitary sewer on Lincoln Avenue up to the parking lots at City Hall. The savings from the project permits the city to perform more work under the 2017 Storm Sewer Separation Program.

Traffic Safety Minutes:

The April meeting of the North Tonawanda Traffic Safety Committee was called to order at 1900 hours. Roll call showed the following members present: J. Sikora, M. Daigler, M. Anastasi, A. DiBernardo, M. Lemke, E. Smolinski, and A. Vater. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and accepted, the following new requests discussed, and recommendations made.

- 1. A request from Ryan Gephardt, for additional "School Zone 20 MPH" signs in the area of Spruce School was discussed. The Committee is in agreement all necessary signs are currently in place. If needed the area can be monitored by NTPD.
- 2. A Terrace Parking application was received from Rachel Waite of 63 8th Avenue. The Committee will discuss the application at a later date after review of the area.

- 3. A request to replace "Yield" signs on Division Street with "Stop" signs was discussed. The Committee does not recommend making the requested change.
- 4. A request from Alan Mazzuchelli, to remove the stop signs located on Payne Avenue at Tremont Street and Goundry Street, was discussed. The Committee is in agreement the signs should remain in place.
- 5. The Committee recommends placing "No Parking" signs in front of 1096 Oliver to improve visibility at the intersection of Oliver and East Felton Streets.
- 6. Member Frank reported: Walck Road has been monitored for commercial vehicle use, 1 ticket was issued. The "No Parking Zone" in front of Wally's Pizza was also monitored, 3 tickets for illegal parking were issued.
- 7. A request from Patrick Lynch, 22 Grant Street, Apt.1. to relocate "No Parking" signs along Grant Street was discussed. All Committee members are going to check the area and the topic will be discussed at the May meeting.
- 8. A request from Barbara Gauchat, 412 Oliver Street, to change ½ hour parking signs in front of her business to 1 hour parking was discussed. The Committee is in agreement with this change and recommends making the change.
- 9. A request from Mike Hacikyan, to replace the traffic signal that was removed from the intersection of Thompson and Main Streets was discussed. Member Frank met with Mr. Hacikyan to discuss the request prior to the meeting. After the discussion the Committee is in agreement to leave the intersection as it is.
