Honorable Mayor and Common Council Members:

Our annual agreement with Enerscope will expire as of June 30, 2017. Enerscope provides consulting services for the procurement of Natural Gas for the Wastewater & Water Treatment Plant.

The renewal fee for the July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018 contract year will be \$3,600.00 (\$300.00 per month) inclusive for the Wastewater account. Continued inclusion of the Water Filtration Plant account for this contract will be an additional \$600.00 (\$50.00 per month). In addition, the annual fee for bidding will be \$690.00. Total annual cost of this contract will be \$4,890.00 which is the same as last year.

Dear Honorable Body:

As you may be aware, the seventh round of state-wide economic development funding through New York State Regional Economic Development Councils has been announced. \$800 Million is available through a pool of over 20 state programs. In previous rounds, North Tonawanda submitted 19 applications and secured over \$2 million. This year's application deadline is July 28th, 2017.

Following a review of North Tonawanda's development plans and consultation with the Mayor and various City officials, we have identified two immediately viable projects. These projects were selected based on a number of factors including project feasibility, project need, funding availability, and project readiness.

The first project application would be for necessary renovations and improvements in Gateway Harbor Park and would total \$600,000 from two New York programs: \$500,000 from the Department of State Local Waterfront Revitalization Program and \$100,000 from the Canal Corporation Canalway Grant program. This project would include construction of a new facilities building with new restrooms, offices and storage space, construction of new docks with all associated utilities between Gateway Harbor and the Dockside Inn, as well as some site improvements in the park like new landscaping and lighting. The grant programs require a 50/50 match from local sources. If awarded, the City would be required to provide a cash match of \$600,000 as well as staff in-kind administration services valued at \$50,000, for a total project cost of approximately \$1,250,000.

The second project application would be for a 'green infrastructure' project to install new green storm water management practices on Main Street between Island Street and Thompson Street. Treating storm water through green infrastructure practices reduces water pollutants, reduces the strain on the municipal water treatment plant, and will provide a new and attractive streetscape for Main Street. The total project is conservatively estimated at \$500,000 with grant applications totaling \$400,000 through the Environmental Facilities Corporation Green Infrastructure grant program and the DEC Water Quality Improvement Program and the City committing \$100,000.

At this time I am requesting that this Honorable Body authorize the submission of applications for these projects.
