MOVED by Alderman Braun SECONDED by Alderman Zadzilka That the Common Council hereby approves the amendment of North Tonawanda City Code Section 69-1 (B) – PLUMBING – "Annual Registration; Surety Bond; Liability Insurance, as follows:

Sec. 69-1. Annual registration; surety; bond; liability insurance.

(B). No registration shall become effective until and unless the following conditions are met:

(1) Effective March 1, 2016, a surety bond is no longer required.

(2) Liability Insurance

(a) The plumber shall file written evidence that there is in force and effect a liability insurance policy issued by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New York to secure and hold the City and its officers harmless against any and all claims, judgments or other costs arising by reason of the issuance of permits to the plumber for which the City, the City Council or any City officer may be made liable by reason of any action or injury to persons or property through the fault of the plumber or for any other injury resulting from the negligence of the plumber. Such insurance shall cover collapse, explosive hazards and underground work by equipment on the street and shall include protection against liability arising from completed operations. The amounts of the liability shall be in the amount of at least \$1,000,000 liability for injuries to one person and \$2,000,000 liability for injuries sustained in each accident and also against legal liability for property damage in the amount of not less than \$100,000, and such policy shall also state that it shall remain in full force without change until the expiration thereof, and it shall not be terminated or canceled for any reason or cause except after 10 days written notice of such proposed termination or cancellation has been duly served upon the City. Such insurance shall also contain a hold-harmless clause or endorsement to provide that the permittee shall save and hold harmless the City of North Tonawanda from any and all damages and liability by reason of bodily injury or property damage arising either directly or indirectly from the work to be performed by the permittee, irrespective of the cause of such injury or damage.

Dear Honorable Body:

Last year the City passed a change to Chapter 65 of the City Code to add in regulations surrounding food trucks. The code at the time was created based upon the small number of local municipalities that had previously passed legislation to regulate food trucks. After a full season has passed, pursuant to the recommendations of the City Clerk's Office, as well as a number of organizations that would have liked to use food trucks at local events, or use them pursuant to the code, it would be my recommendation to adjust

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certain parts of the food truck code to allow for a smoother process for licensing as well as the ability for groups to use food trucks for their fundraisers and/or events, such as the school district.

The changes to the code as attached would allow for one license to be issued to all food trucks, to eliminate confusion. These updates would make the City on equal field with the City of Tonawanda, who often participates with the City in events that include food trucks.
