The March 2021 meeting of the North Tonawanda Traffic Safety Committee was called to order at 1730 hours. Roll call showed the following members present: R. Frank, J. Sikora, M. Daigler, M. Anastasi, the minutes from the previous meeting were read and accepted, the following new concerns/requests were discussed, and recommendations made.

1.) Councilman Robert Pecoraro received a complaint from Greg Lureman of 201 12th Avenue regarding speeding on 12th Avenue. Lureman believes that if we installed 20 MPH signs it would fix the problem. Traffic Officer Otabachian spoke with Lureman and advised him that he would monitor the street for speeders and that the speed sign would be placed on 12th Avenue this spring. Member Meisenburg is looking into the request for 20 MPH signs.

2.) City Clerk Donna Braun requested that Oakwood Terrace be checked for speeders again. Traffic Officer Otabachian monitored the street several times and did not find anyone speeding. Otabachian spoke with the North Tonawanda City Schools bus garage supervisor Tom Witt. Witt stated that he would advise his bus drivers to use caution when traveling down Oakwood Terrace.

3.) Member Meisenburg received a request from a resident on Fredericka Street to take down the "Deaf Child Area" sign. The resident doesn't believe that the sign is needed anymore. Meisenburg advised the resident to talk to his neighbors and make sure that the person who the sign was designated for is not living on the street anymore.

4.) Councilman Eric Zadzilka stated that the railroad tracks are coming upon Erie Avenue and Niagara Falls Boulevard. Member Frank spoke with a CSX supervisor, Mason Butler,

who stated that he would set up a time to get the railroad tracks fixed. Member Meisenburg was contacted by Ed Rutkowski of CSX. Rutkowski advised Meisenburg that CSX would be out before summer to fix the railroad tracks and that they would take care of securing the Intersection.

My name is Larry McKenzie, Chair of the 2021 Western NY Hydrocephalus Association (HA) WALK, scheduled for Saturday, September 11, 2021. We are a non-profit 501-C-3 group.

We are seeking permission to conduct a Chicken BBQ Drive-Thru dinner fundraiser at Gratwick Park. The date we are seeking is Saturday, May 8, 2021 beginning with setup around 8:00 am and with completion by around 4:00 pm. We are also considering having some form of entertainment as the cars drive thru.

Hydrocephalus is caused by an excess accumulation of cerebral spinal fluid, placing the brain under pressure. There is no prevention-there is no cure. Current treatment methods may require patients endure multiple (sometimes dozens) of brain surgeries throughout their lifetime. Anyone, at any age, may be diagnosed with hydrocephalus. Unfortunately, head injuries to U.S. military personnel serving in Iraq and Afghanistan which resulted in hydrocephalus are dramatically increasing the numbers of Americans living with this challenging and complex condition.

The Hydrocephalus Association was founded in 1983 by parents of children with hydrocephalus who wanted to give everyone with hydrocephalus a better future -free of hydrocephalus constant life threatening complications. HA is dedicated to eliminating the challenges of hydrocephalus. To achieve that HA added funding research to its portfolio of services just a few years ago-and is now the largest non-profit, non-governmental funder of hydrocephalus research in the world. The money raised with the Western NY HA WALK will be used to fund research and program services.
