RESOLUTION FOR THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS TO TRAIN AND EQUIP THE NORTH TONAWANDA POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR NOISE ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT

Submitted by President DiBernardo & Aldermen Marranca, Lavey, Schmigel & Loncar

WHEREAS, in order to legally enforce noise ordinances in New York State, the North Tonawanda Police Department must be trained, certified, and possess properly calibrated equipment; and

WHEREAS, noise ordinances must be enforced equitably across both residential and commercial properties to ensure the peace and well-being of all community members; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council recognizes the importance of providing the North Tonawanda Police Department with the tools and training required for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, according to the Noise Pollution Clearinghouse, a national non-profit organization focused on noise pollution, meters can cost between \$250 and \$500, calibrators cost about \$500, and training eight officers costs approximately \$5,000,

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, if the North Tonawanda Police Department is unable to locate the necessary funds within its existing budget, the North Tonawanda Common Council hereby allocates \$10,000 from the General Reserve Fund to the North Tonawanda Police Department for the purpose of:

- 1. Training and Certification: Sending officers to obtain the necessary training and certification to use sound level meters and other relevant equipment effectively and legally.
- 2. Purchasing Equipment: Acquiring certified sound level meters, calibrators, and any other necessary equipment required to enforce noise ordinances.

AND LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the North Tonawanda Police Department is encouraged to maintain open communication with the Common Council regarding the use of these funds and to notify the Council if additional funding is required.

Attached for consideration is the adoption of a new local law, Solar Energy Systems Regulations, which aims to regulate the types of solar installations within the City of North Tonawanda. This ordinance ensures the proper siting of solar energy systems to protect our residential and business areas, preserve the city's beauty and character, promote the efficient use of solar energy resources, and safeguard the health, safety, and welfare of our citizens.

The proposed local law includes two tiers of solar energy systems. Tier 1 includes building-integrated photovoltaic systems, while Tier 2 includes ground-mounted solar energy systems. The local law specifies that all solar energy systems must comply with applicable building codes, green codes, unified solar permit requirements, and county regulations.

Tier 1 building-integrated systems would be allowed in all zoning districts, while Tier 2 systems are limited to industrial districts, further protecting our residential neighborhoods and other sensitive areas.

By adopting this local law, the City of North Tonawanda will be taking a proactive approach to managing solar energy systems within our community. This strikes a balance between promoting the use of solar energy as an alternative energy source and ensuring that it is done in a way that is compatible with our existing land uses and preserves our city's unique character.

The attached local law has been reviewed and improved thanks to our Building Inspector Rob DePaolo as well. Passage of this will demonstrate our commitment to sustainable energy practices while protecting the interests of our residents and businesses.

CIT OF NORTH TONAWANDA LOCAL LAW #2024-1

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS REGULATIONS

Submitted by: Mayor Austin Tylec

Definitions.

SOLAR COLLECTOR - A solar or photovoltaic cell, plate, panel, film, array, reflector, or other structure affixed to the ground, a building, or other structure that harnesses solar radiation to directly or indirectly generate thermal, chemical, electrical, or other usable energy.

SOLAR ENERGY EQUIPMENT— Electrical material, hardware, inverters, conduit, storage devices, or other electrical and photovoltaic equipment associated with the production of electricity.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM: The components and subsystems required to convert solar energy into electric energy suitable for use. The term includes, but is not limited to, Solar Panels and Solar Energy equipment. A Solar Energy System is classified as a Tier 1 or Tier 2 Solar Energy System as follows.

A. Tier 1 Solar Energy Systems include the following:

 BUILDING INTEGRATED PHOTOVOLTAIC (BIPV) SYSTEM (TIER 1) - A combination of photovoltaic building components integrated into any building envelope system, such as vertical facades including glass and other facade material, semitransparent skylight systems, roofing materials and shading over windows.

B. Tier 2 Solar Energy Systems include the following:

1. Ground-Mounted Solar Energy Systems not included under Tier 1 Solar Energy Systems, intended to generate electricity for use on site or off site.

Applicability.

- A. The requirements of this Local Law shall apply to all Solar Energy Systems permitted, installed, or modified in the City after the effective date of this Local Law, excluding general maintenance and repair.
- B. Solar Energy Systems constructed or installed prior to the effective date of this Local Law shall not be required to meet the requirements of this Local Law.
- C. All Solar Energy Systems shall be designed, erected, and installed in accordance with all applicable codes, regulations, and industry standards as referenced in the NYS Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code ("Building Code"), the NYS Energy Conservation Code ("Energy Code"), Niagara County's Solar Panel Recycling Regulations and the City Code.

General permitting requirements.

- A. The NYS Unified Solar Permit and Building Permit shall be required for installation of all Tier 1 & Tier 2 Solar Energy Systems.
- B. The placement, construction, and major modification of all solar energy systems within the boundaries of the City of North Tonawanda shall be permitted only as follows:

- 1. Tier 1 systems are permitted in all zoning districts in the city.
- 2. Tier 2 systems are allowed in the following districts:
 - a. Industrial districts (M-1, M-2, M-3).
- 3. Tier 2 energy systems shall require site plan approval, before the issuance of a building permit and shall be subject to all provisions of this article where the lot in which the freestanding or ground-mounted solar energy system is situated on.

Preliminary Site Plan Review - Tier 2 Solar Energy Systems.

For Tier 2 solar energy systems, a site plan shall be required. The applicant shall be required to apply for a permit and a site plan review drawn in sufficient detail per the North Tonawanda Building Department.

Final Site Plan Review.

Applicants for a special use permit to place, construct, and make a major modification to a Tier 2 solar energy system within the boundaries of the City of North Tonawanda may require submission of the following information to the Building Inspector:

- A completed State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) short form environmental
 assessment form (EAF), unless a full form is required by the City's professional engineer or
 consultant or the City of North Tonawanda Planning Commission, with the City of North
 Tonawanda Planning Commission designated as lead agency for the SEQRA process.
- A site plan drawn of the solar energy system installation signed by a professional engineer
 registered in New York State showing the proposal layout of the entire solar energy system
 along with a description of all components, existing vegetation and proposed clearing and
 grading of all sites involved, and utility lines, both above and below the ground, on the site and
 adjacent to the site.
- 3. Property lot lines and the location and dimensions of all existing & new structures on site.
- 4. Proposed fencing and/or screening for project.
- 5. Clearing, grading, stormwater, and erosion control.
- 6. Glare All Solar Panels shall have anti-reflective coating(s) and proof of such must be provided with the site plan and then the building permit applications.
- 7. A preliminary equipment specification sheet that documents all proposed solar panels, significant components, mounting systems, and inverters that are to be installed shall be provide with the site plan/permit application. A final equipment specification sheet shall be submitted prior to the issuance of building permit.
- 8. Any such additional information as may be required by the City.

Application and annual fees.

A. Tier 1 & Tier 2 solar energy systems. An applicant shall pay a permit fee in the amount as set by the Building Inspector to cover the cost of processing and reviewing the application.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and conditions set forth, Lessor and Lessee hereby agree to the following amendments to the original Agreement.

- 1. Paragraph 5 to be amended as follows:
 - "5. Security/Emergency Personnel: In addition to the aforementioned rent set forth in paragraph 3 above, lessee shall provide proper security guards/parking attendants for the event, the proper number to be at the discretion of the North Tonawanda Police Chief.
 - The number of said uniformed North Tonawanda Police Officers shall by at the sole discretion of the North Tonawanda Police Chief at the sole expense of the lessee. Lessor will make the North Tonawanda auxiliary police available to assist with traffic control at the said venue on the agreed upon dates."
- 2. Paragraph 6 to be removed and replaced as follows:
 - "6. Restrooms: The lessor hereby allows the use of the Park's restroom facilities for each concert. Such permission shall be withdrawn, if, in lessor's sole opinion, the facilities are misused, damaged, vandalized or in any other way diminished. The lessee hereby agrees to pay to the lessor \$170 per concert for said use. Said payment to be paid no later than ten days after the final concert. In addition, Lessee shall provide a minimum of eight (8) portable restrooms for each concert at their sole expense."
