

City of North Tonawanda**

The City of North Tonawanda will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, September 9th at 6:00 PM at North Tonawanda City Hall, Council Chambers, 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York for the purpose of hearing public comments on the City of North Tonawanda's community development needs, and to discuss the possible submission of one or more Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications for the 2025 program year.


The CDBG program is administered by the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR) and will make available to eligible local governments approximately \$40 million for the 2025 program year for housing, economic development, public facilities, public infrastructure, and planning activities, with the principal purpose of benefiting low-to-moderate income persons. The City of North Tonawanda is considering applying for a \$100,000 economic development grant. This program would provide up to \$84,000 to the Niagara Climbing Center to implement their proposed expansion project and to meet the HUD National Objective by creating new job positions made available to low-to-moderate income persons. The remaining funding will be utilized for expenses related to program delivery and grant administration. The hearing will provide further information about the CDBG program, including prior City of North Tonawanda CDBG projects, progress towards beneficiary goals and program objectives, and will allow for citizen participation in the development of any proposed grant applications and/or provide technical assistance to develop alternate proposals. Comments on the CDBG program or proposed project(s) will be received at this time. The hearing is being conducted pursuant to Section 570.486, Subpart I of the CFR and in compliance with the requirements of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The location of the hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. If special accommodations are needed for persons with disabilities, those with hearing impairments, or those in need of translation from English, those individuals should contact Donna Braun at 716,895-8555, at least three days in advance of the hearing date to allow for necessary arrangements. Written comments may also be submitted to Donna Braun at City Hall, 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York, 14020, until September 12th, 2025.



Below for your consideration, are two (2) proposed ordinance revisions (**in bold print**) under North Tonawanda City Code Chapter 63 –2 Parks and Recreation Areas.


§ 63-2 Motor Vehicles, Motorcycles, and Drones prohibited; Exception

(b) **No person shall operate a drone, or any other remote controlled pilotless aircraft in any park, playground, athletic field or swimming area in the city of North Tonawanda without first obtaining written permission from the North Tonawanda Department of Youth, Recreation, Parks and Seniors Department.**

(1) **While such written permission shall not be unreasonably withheld, factors such as proximity to private property, time of year, designated swimming areas, private reserved functions, and preservation of public and private property shall be taken into consideration.**

If your Honorable body concurs, please pass the appropriate resolutions for the City of North Tonawanda to allow these additions to our North Tonawanda City Code, subject to further review by the City Attorney.


Re: Project No. 2017-04 Payne and Meadow Intersection Improvements – Utility Easement with National Grid

GRANT OF EASEMENT

CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, having an address at 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York 14120 (hereinafter referred to as “Grantor”), is the owner of that certain parcel of real property commonly known as 1069 Payne Avenue located in the Town of North Tonawanda, County of Niagara in the State of New York, identified on the tax maps of the County of Niagara, as Section 182.05/Block 2/Lot 1 (SBL# 185.05-2-1) and pursuant to that certain deed recorded with the County Clerk of the County of Niagara on August 13, 2025 in Liber 1558 at Page 638, Instrument #2025-11809 (the “Grantor’s Land”), and Grantor, for consideration in the amount of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable considerations, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, hereby grants to **NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION**, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202 and **VERIZON NEW YORK, INC.** having an address at 140 West Street, New York, New York 10007 (hereinafter collectively referred to as “Grantees”), for Grantees and their lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns a perpetual and nonexclusive easement and right of way through, over, across, under and upon the Grantor’s Land (the “Easement”) under the following terms and conditions.

Section 1 – Description of the Easement. The Easement provides the Grantees with the right, privilege, and authority to:

a. construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at their pleasure, remove any poles or lines of poles, supporting structures, cables, crossarms, overhead and underground wires, guys, guy stubs, insulators, transformers, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, communications facilities, and other fixtures and appurtenances (collectively, the “Facilities”), which the Grantees shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of high and low voltage electric current and for the purpose of transmitting intelligence and communication data, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for public or private use, in, through, upon, over, under, and across that certain portion of the Grantor’s Land described in Section 2 below (the “Easement Area”), and any highways abutting or running through the Grantor’s Land, and to renew, replace, remove, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing service to the Grantor and others; and

b. from time to time, without further payment therefor, to clear the Easement Area of obstructions or structures, and clear and keep cleared the Easement Area by physical and/or mechanical means, of any and all brush, trees, limbs, branches, roots, vegetation, or other obstructions; and

c. from time to time, without further payment therefor, to clear and keep cleared by physical and/or mechanical means, the Grantor’s Land beyond the bounds of the Easement Area, of any and all trees, limbs, branches, roots or vegetation that, in the sole judgment of the Grantees, due to species or structural defects or their tall growing nature, are likely to fall into or encroach upon the Easement Area or interfere in any way with the safe and reliable operation of Grantees’ existing or proposed Facilities; and

d. excavate or change the grade of the Grantor’s Land as is reasonable, necessary, and proper for any and all purposes described in this Easement; provided, however, that the Grantees will, upon completion of the work, backfill and restore any excavated areas to reasonably the same condition as existed prior to such excavation; and

e. pass and repass on foot and with vehicles and equipment, along, over, across and upon the Easement Area and the Grantor’s Land in order to access the Easement Area and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain roads, paths, causeways, and ways of access to and from the Easement Area as is reasonable and necessary in order to exercise to the fullest extent the Easement.

Section 2 – Location of the Easement Area. The “Easement Area” shall consist of a portion of the Grantor’s Land twenty (20) feet in width throughout its extent, the centerline of the Easement Area being the centerline of the Facilities. The general location of the Easement Area is shown on the sketch entitled, “**Easement Sketch-Exhibit A, WR# 31139269**”, which sketch is attached hereto as Exhibit A and recorded herewith. The final and definitive location(s) of the Easement Area shall become established by and upon the final installation and erection of the Facilities by the Grantees in substantial compliance with Exhibit A hereto.


Section 3 – Facilities Ownership. It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantees, their successors and assigns.

Section 4 – General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantees that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted; no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto,







A RESOLUTION, DATED SEPTEMBER 2, 2025, OF THE CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, COUNTY OF NIAGARA, NEW YORK AS TO SEQRA DETERMINATION

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of North Tonawanda, located in the County of Niagara, State of New York (the “City”), desires to finance the construction and reconstruction of improvements to the City’s Erie Water Tower, all at a maximum cost not to exceed \$2,000,000 (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, said Project is subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”); and

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "CITY") AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,000,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE CITY TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CITY'S ERIE WATER TOWER

WHEREAS, the Common Council (the "Common Council") of the City of North Tonawanda (the "City") proposes to authorize the issuance of \$2,000,000 in serial bonds of the City to finance the construction and reconstruction of improvements to the City's Erie Water Tower, including all ancillary, incidental and related equipment, machinery, apparatus, costs and expenses thereof (the "Project") at an estimated maximum cost of \$2,000,000; and

WHEREAS, immediately prior to the adoption of this resolution, the Common Council of the City determined pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA"), determined that the Project constitutes a "Type II" action within the meaning of the SEQRA and therefore no further action under SEQRA with respect to the Project need be taken by the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council now wishes to appropriate funds for the Project and to authorize the issuance of the City's serial bonds and bond anticipation notes to be issued to finance said appropriation.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK HEREBY RESOLVES (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of such body), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City is hereby authorized to undertake the construction and reconstruction of improvements to City's Erie Water Tower, including all ancillary, incidental and related equipment, machinery, apparatus, costs and expenses thereof. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforementioned class of object or purpose is \$2,000,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of up to \$2,000,000 in serial bonds of the City authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds, (ii) the application of up to \$1,400,000 in grant monies expected to be received by the City to pay or reimburse costs of the Project (including the possible repayment of bond anticipation notes issued to finance such costs), the receipt of which shall reduce the amount of serial bonds authorized herein *pro tanto*, and (iii) unless paid from other sources, the levy and collection of taxes on all taxable real property of the City to pay the principal of such bonds or notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 2. Serial bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$2,000,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to provisions of Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law") to finance the Project.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforementioned class of object or purpose is forty (40) years, pursuant to subdivision 1. of paragraph a. of Section 11.00 of the Law.

SECTION 4. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this resolution.

SECTION 5. The temporary use of available funds of the City, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purpose described in this resolution. This resolution shall constitute a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures as part of the project described herein with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 6. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the City without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

SECTION 7. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said obligations, and of Section 21.00, Section 50.00, Section 54.90, Sections 56.00 through 60.00, Section 62.10 and Section 63.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Common Council relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of bonds herein authorized, including without limitation the determination of whether to issue bonds having substantially level or declining debt service and all matters related thereto, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the City Clerk-Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of the City. However, prior to the sale and issuance of any obligations authorized herein, after reviewing such terms, form and contents, the Common Council shall adopt an additional resolution authorizing the City-Clerk Treasurer to issue said obligations authorized herein. Further, pursuant to subdivision b. of Section 11.00 of the Law, in the event that bonds to be issued for any of the objects or purposes authorized by this resolution are combined for sale, pursuant to subdivision c. of Section 57.00 of the Law, with bonds to be issued for one or more other objects or purposes authorized by this resolution or other resolutions of the Common Council, then the power of the Common Council to determine the "weighted average period of probable usefulness" (within the meaning of subdivision a. of

Section 11.00 of the Law) for such combined objects or purposes is hereby delegated to the City Clerk-Treasurer, as the chief fiscal officer of the City.

SECTION 8. The City Clerk-Treasurer is hereby further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk-Treasurer is hereby further authorized, at their sole discretion, to execute a project financing and loan agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a serial bond, and, or a bond anticipation note issue in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

SECTION 10. The City Clerk-Treasurer is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure undertaking with or for the benefit of the initial purchaser of any of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 11. The intent of this resolution is to give the City Clerk-Treasurer sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements, instruments or to do any similar acts necessary to effect the issuance of the aforesaid serial bonds or bond anticipation notes without resorting to further action of this Common Council.

SECTION 12. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money; or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
