Mayor Pappas & Common Council Members:

In the summer of 2017 Water Treatment Plant Chief Operator Dave Conti, City Engineer Dale Marshall, Assistant City Engineer Chelsea Spahr and I inspected a very large crack in the wall of the Water Filtration Plant's Sand Filter building and leaking pipe in the basement of the same building.

In October of 2017, we had three Engineering Firms, give us price quotes on the evaluation & cost of their services for these structural repairs. The price quotes are as follows:

1.	Wendel Engineering	\$14,250
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2. Nussbaumer & Clarke \$ 8,900

3. GPI Engineering\$46,676

After thorough review of the proposals and speaking with each Engineering Firm, <u>we</u> would like to recommend the attached proposal from Wendel Engineering at a cost of <u>\$14,250</u>. We found that the level of services as compared to the cost will give the City "the biggest bag for our buck" for this project.

Dear Honorable Body:

Please be advised that this office sent out a Request for Proposal (RFP) on November 7, 2017, to nine (9) qualified Information Technology firms to perform complete business technology services for the City of North Tonawanda. The evaluation of each firm was based on the following criteria: (1) Strategic plan for services to address the technology needs of the City (2) Strategic plan presented for the City's telephone/communications

system (3) The proposing firms qualifications and experience, the staffs qualifications and resources available to meet the City's needs; and (4) cost/proposed fee structure. Four proposals were received by the City. Each proposal was ranked by a committee comprised of four (4) City Officials/Employees. Based on the criteria defined above, and interviews conducted with the top four firms, the four proposals received were ranked as follows:

<u>Consulting Firm</u> 1 – Usitek*	<u>Cost</u> Estimated Year 1 Cost = \$165,750, Year 2 = \$153,000
2 – MVP Consulting	Estimated Year 1 Cost = \$90,000, Year 2 = \$84,000
3 – Synchronet	Estimated Year 1 Cost = \$87,800, Year 2 = \$82,800
4 – Network Services	Block pricing provided; annual cost not estimable

*eliminated from consideration due to the presentation of an estimated cost that is outside the City's budget

Based on our evaluation of the rating criteria and the annual cost to the City, it is our recommendation that MVP, be awarded a one-year contract with the City of North Tonawanda at an estimated cost of \$90,000 annually. Contract will be awarded upon the completion of a background investigation and the review and approval of the City Attorney. Whereas, such resolution will result in the need for a budget transfer of \$40,000 from Account 1.3120.410, Police Administration, \$5,000 from 1.1670.410 Central Data Processing, and \$15,000 from Central Communications System, into Account 1.1315.441, Contractual IT, to consolidate these services amongst departments.

I would like to see it at the corner of Ruie and Nash in front of the school. John always teaches people about Flags and Flag etiquette.

<u>Kim Monkiewicz 432 Wheatfield</u> – I understand that there is a discussion about possible turning Wheatfield Street into a designated East/West truck route. This is not a good idea. There is too much infrastructure under the street that will get damaged. We have the votes to stop this.

<u>Diane Czajkowski 1230 East Robinson</u> – I am the Treasurer of Glory Be To Kids Inc. Every year we raise money for local kid's charities. For the support the City gives us in holding these events, we are going to donate \$500.00 to the Recreation Department to use for kids programs.

Zack Niemiec 384 Robinson – I know you guys are holding a public forum later this month, but I am not sure I will be able to come to it. I would like you to do a Traffic Study before you guys make any decision. My house and many others have cracks in the walls from trucks driving down the street.

<u>Jan MacDonald 396 Wheatfield</u> – I would first like to congratulate Austin. No one in North Tonawanda wanted a designated East/West truck route. Also Lockport's water line is under Wheatfield Street and the street is not laded down correctly. According NY State this road is not graded correctly for a truck route.

<u>Robert Lacey 395 Wheatfield Street</u> – I would like to know if the street is zoned commercial. We have a lot of trucks coming down the street anyway. I think it would also be a liability. We don't need this to be a designated truck route. It is going to get worse. The streets are too narrow.

<u>Richard Yager 337 Robinson</u> – I would like to invite everyone to come sit on my porch on a Saturday, Tuesday and Thursday. You cannot get out of my driveway. If you designated this a truck route you will have three blocks of tie ups.

<u>Rob Frank 316 Brentwood Drive</u> – I am a member of the Traffic Safety Committee and just so you know, no decision has been made. This has been just a discussion. We are just an advisory committee. For some reason people are coming up thinking a decision has already been made. We are just trying to figure this out.

<u>Dennis Garland 238 Tremont</u> – Growth is good, but it needs to be carefully managed. I am trying to find a comprehensive plan for the City. Is there one available?

<u>Shawn Nickerson 324 Wheatfield Street</u> – I am pleased that no decision has been made. It was wrong that the committee letter was put in the newspaper. It is bad government. Traffic Safety is only an advisory board.

<u>Cathy Condon 337 Robinson</u> – I am not here about the trucks, I want to talk about the garbage. People cut through our yard to go to the market and they leave garbage on the ground. I am asking if the City can leave a garbage can at the corner so people walking through have a place to put the garbage.

<u>Sonia Dusza 123 Miller</u> – Interesting comments. Big picture as I hear Master plan, transparency and code enforcement. We haven't had Code Enforcement since I have lived here. We are not Buffalo or Amherst. We are a bedroom community. If you want big business you are going to have big trucks. We have allowed businesses into our community that have created negative impacts. We are the center of Western, NY. What limits and strengths do we have? The master plan is so important. Our new website sucks.
