WHEREAS, exposure to secondhand smoke causes death and many diseases including cancer; and

aller a full WHEREAS, the U.S. Surgeon General concluded in a 2004 report that smoking has a direct relationship with various forms of cancer; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Surgeon General concluded in a 2010 report that even occasional secondhand smoke is harmful: and

WHEREAS, smoke free workplace laws protect people from secondhand smoke, reduce tobacco use overall and reduce health care costs; and

WHEREAS, the Community Health Alliance of North Tonawanda 2020 Preventative Health Assessment identified a linear increase for youth e-cigarette/vaping use as grade increases; and

WHEREAS, tobacco free environments are more family friendly and provide the following impacts:

- Health Impacts: Improves community health, reduces health risks and exposure to secondhand smoke and/or e-cigarette aerosol, especially among children and those with chronic conditions.
- Environmental Impacts: Protects against litter and fires, protects green spaces and animal habitats (cigarette butts contribute to 1/3 of all litter collected)
- Social Impact: Lead by example children/teen emulate adults, parks enhance quality of life.
- Economic Impacts: Decrease maintenance/clean-up costs, increase health of community members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to Section 79 of the North Tonawanda City Code, the City Council of the City of North Tonawanda does hereby declare the follow:

- 1. Smoking a cigarette, pipe, cigar, electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, vape pen, any cartridge or other component of the device or related product or any other matter of substance which contains tobacco, nicotine, any illegal substance or any other substance that is similar shall be prohibited as follows:
- A. At all times on the grounds of North Tonawanda City Parks

- B. "No Smoking/Vaping" signs shall be placed on the property entrances at an appropriate location on the park entrances.
- C. Penalties for Offences
- 1) Smoking of tobacco, nicotine and other similar products shall be unlawful in the areas posted as stated in this Chapter.
- 2) A violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$250 for each offense or imprisonment for not more than 15 days for each offense, or both fine and imprisonment.
- D, Severability
- 1) The several terms and provisions of this section shall be deemed severable, and if any provision hereof or the application hereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the section and the applicability of such provisions to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby. E. When effective



WHEREAS, the City of North Tonawanda has been approved for and is receiving funding from NYSDOT, East Hill Foundation, Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, and Greenway Fund Committee for a project known as the Bike Path Connection to the Empire State Trail, PIN 5763.51; and

The City of Tonawanda, undersigned owner of public land that is located on the following streets within the City of Tonawanda:

hereby grants permission and gives consent to the City of North Tonawanda or its contractors or designees, to enter onto the property identified above in connection with the above referenced contract for the purpose(s) identified below.

This permission is granted with the understanding that such work shall be limited to:

- Access to the lands on Main Street as noted in the Highway Plans for purposes of completing construction of the Bike Path Connection (in this case, pavement markings to install dedicated bike lanes on the Main Street Bridge) shown on the plans for public use;
- Work zone traffic control on the roadway approaches to the Main Street Bridge.

The work is scheduled to occur between the months of April, 2021 and October, 2021. The City of North Tonawanda will contact the City of Tonawanda if these dates change.

Whereas the City of Tonawanda and the City of North Tonawanda are both acceptable project applicants and sponsors of federal aid highway projects as determined by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT),

Whereas this agreement will be recorded in the County of Niagara Clerk's office, by the project sponsor, with illustration or mapping,



Approval of Wendel Engineering Amendment #5 of the North Tonawanda Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Standby Generator Replacement Project is hereby requested. This work is necessary to ensure the safe and proper support for the new Generator. The Amendment represents the following additional work:

•	Wendel Engineering & Design services	\$282,700.00
•	Goodwin Electric – revisions to electrical equipment	\$340,327.00
•	STC Construction - revisions to electrical, fuel system and Window	\$51,750.00

The total project cost estimate of this project is \$3,061,512. The City recently received a NY State WIIA Grant in the amount of \$1,836,907 which amounts to 60% of the total cost. That coupled with the City previously approving the use of \$1,224,605 out of reserve funds completes the funding for this project.

The items in this Amendment were included with the original project Bid as "Add-Alternates". The cost is within the current \$3,061,512.00 project budget and therefore will not result in a change in original contract cost.

Understand that raising prices is never something we desire to do, especially during difficult times; however, it is important to remain fiscally responsible and so the proposed fee increases are reflective of the increased costs of doing business (seasonal wages, maintenance costs, etc). For your convenience I've including cost comparisons of similar programs from neighboring municipalities, as well as some notes for consideration related to the cost changes.

Upon your review, I respectfully ask for your approval for the fee changes to be implemented beginning in the 2021 calendar year.

Notes/Justification: Last time fees were changed was 2019 (with exception of Senior Rates which were not touched).

- In those two years, with state mandated minimum wage increases, it will cost and additional \$27,300 in seasonal staffing alone for course operations and maintenance.
- Assuming COVID-19 restrictions will still be in place for the golf season, we will need to once again increase our seasonal cart supply by 30 carts to meet the needs of the golfers. This is an added cost of \$15,000 to the City for the season.
- With proposed increases in fees we are still at a lower playing cost than comparable municipal courses such as Brighton & Sheridan.

The Independent Contractor assumes all risk for profit or loss in providing services to the client and is free to establish the hours of work and schedule of activities under this agreement without control or stipulations by the client.

The Independent Contractor will function without the direct supervision of the client and will provide all facilities, equipment and supplies for the performance of the services under this agreement.

The Independent Contractor, under the terms of this agreement, will provide the following services to the client:

- 1. To conduct the Youth Court Program on an ongoing basis which will hold court at least once per month.
- 2. To recruit new agencies which are willing to supervise youth who are required to complete community service hours.
- 3. To organize and implement a Community Relations Seminar.
- 4. To conduct recruiting and training for youth interested in becoming Youth Court officials.
- 5. To conduct the First Offender Program on an ongoing basis.
- 6. To divert 20 offenders between the ages of 13-21 from the criminal justice system. The groups will consist of no more than 20 youth per group.

The Independent Contractor will receive from the client the amount of \$18,831.96 (eighteen thousand eight hundred and thirty one dollars and ninety six cents) for the satisfactory delivery of the services specified in the above paragraph. This amount will be paid in a monthly amount of \$1569.33 (one thousand five hundred and sixty nine dollars and thirty three cents) per month.

The Client shall not be liable to the Independent Contractor for any expenses paid or incurred by the Independent Contractor beyond the stipulations of this agreement unless otherwise agreed in writing.

The Independent Contractor shall supply, at Independent Contractor's sole expense, all equipment, materials and/or supplies to provide the service here-to-fore agreed.

Neither federal, nor state, nor local income tax nor payroll tax of any kind shall be withheld or paid by CLIENT on behalf of the Independent Contractor or the employees of the Independent Contractor.

Because the Independent Contractor is engaged in her own independent business, the Independent Contractor is not eligible for, and shall not participate in, any employer pension, health or other fringe benefit plan of the CLIENT.

The Independent Contractor understands that she is responsible to pay, according to federal and state law, the Independent Contractor's income taxes. The Independent Contractor further understands that she may be liable for self-employment (Social Security) tax, to be paid by the Independent Contractor according to law.

No workers' compensation insurance shall be obtained by the CLIENT concerning the Independent Contractor or the employees of the Independent Contractor. The Independent Contractor shall comply with the workers' compensation law concerning the Independent Contractor and the employees of the Independent Contractor.

Without cause, either party may terminate this agreement after giving 30 days written notice to the other of intent to terminate without cause. The parties shall deal with each other in good faith during the 30 day period after any notice of intent to terminate without cause has been given.

With reasonable cause, either party may terminate this agreement effective immediately upon giving of written notice of termination for cause. Reasonable cause shall include:

- 1. Material violation of this agreement.
- Any act exposing the other party to liability to others for personal injury or property damage.

The failure of either party to exercise any of its rights under this agreement for breach thereof shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such rights or a waiver of any subsequent breach.

The Independent Contractor has no authority to enter into contracts or agreements on half of the CLIENT. This agreement does not create a partnership between the Independent Contractor and the CLIENT.

The Independent Contractor declares that she has complied with all federal, state and local laws regarding business permits and licenses that may be required to carry out the work to be performed under this agreement.

Any notice given in connection with this agreement shall be given in writing and shall be delivered either by hand to the party or by certified mail, return receipt required, to the party at the party's address stated herein. Any party may change its business address stated herein by giving notice of the change in accordance with this paragraph.

Any dispute under this agreement or related to this agreement shall be decided in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.

This is the entire agreement of the parties and cannot be changed or modified orally.

If any part of this agreement shall be held unenforceable, the rest of this agreement will nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

This agreement may be supplemented, amended or revised only in writing by agreement of the parties.
