Dear Honorable Body,

I am requesting the council approve a raise in pay for the police matrons. Our matrons play a vital role in our police department. They are responsible for the intake process of female prisoners, which includes thorough pat-downs and searches of female prisoners and the securing of a prisoner's personal property. The matrons have supervision and control over all female prisoners within our building and keep a constant watch over them to ensure their safety and prevent any suicide attempts that may take place while in the cell.

Now more than ever, with extensive police reform and a spotlight on in-custody inmate deaths taking place in several different jail facilities, well-trained matrons are a necessary part of our police department. These matrons are becoming extremely difficult to find and keep on our payroll for any length of time.

I feel the current payrate of \$13.25/hour with a \$100/week flat stipend is simply too low and is a direct reflection of our inability to hire and keep the staff that is needed. Because of our shortage of matrons, we have been paying our female police officers overtime to watch female prisoners which is an unnecessary draw on our overtime budget. This year, we have paid approximately \$1200 to our female officers working overtime to fill in to cover our matron shortage. I believe a payrate of \$18.00/hour with a \$100/week flat stipend for our current and future matrons is commensurate with the duties required and more fitting to today's cost of living. Thank you for your consideration.

I am requesting the council approve the following addition to our city's city ordinances:

(NEW) Part 5
Removal of Vehicles

96-14A (new). Persistent Violators

- A. Upon 3 or more unanswered violations of the preceding parking restrictions as set out in Section 96, Article I, the City may remove said vehicle to any place or garage designated by the Chief of Police at the owner's expense. Said vehicle may be released subsequent to payment of all unanswered violations.
- B. The owner, or person in charge of said vehicle, may redeem the same upon payment of the amount of all expenses actually and necessarily incurred in effecting such removal, together with any charges for storage, in addition to payment of all unanswered violations.
- C. The Police Department shall have the duty to ascertain to the extent possible the owner of the vehicle or a person having charge of same, to notify him of the removal and disposition of such vehicle and of the amount which will be required to redeem same and to comply in all other respects with the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

The City Clerk-Treasurer's office is currently inundated with unpaid parking tickets. Their office submits a list of vehicles with more than three unpaid tickets to our police department, at which time theses vehicles, if found to be parked on a public street, are towed and held until payments are settled. After working with our city attorney on this issue, I would like this addition to our city's ordinances to reflect the current policies that are in place to help alleviate the burden of persistent violators of unpaid parking tickets.

Traffic Safety Minutes:

The May 2022 meeting of the North Tonawanda Traffic Safety Committee was called to order at 1800 hours. Roll call showed the following members present: R. Frank, J. Sikora, M. Meisenburg, M. Lemke, A. DiBernardo, D. Grinnell, R. Brennon. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and accepted, the following new concerns/requests were discussed, and recommendations made.

- 1.) The Clerk's Office received a complaint that there are no "No Parking" signs in front of a 100 Oliver Street, yet vehicles were still getting no parking tickets. Member Frank and Meisenburg went to 100 Oliver Street to find that this was false. There are "No Parking" signs in posted in front of 100 Oliver Street.
- 2.) Mayor Tylec received a request for a crosswalk at Sweeney Street and Spruce Street. This request was sent to the committee before, and we found that there must be a sidewalk for the crosswalk to attach to. This is a good idea although the city would have to pay for new sidewalks. Mayor Tylec was advised.
- 3.) The committee received a complaint regarding speeding on Sweeney Street. The traffic officer and ADP program will be monitoring this. We will also put Sweeney Street on the list for the speed sign.
- 4.) Member Brennon received a request for speed limit signs on North Avenue as there are none on this street. Member Meisenburg will post "30 MPH" speed limit signs next week.
- 5.) Member Brennon received a request for a light removal at Sweeney Street and Webster Street. The committee was informed that this light should stay up as part of a new project in which there will be part of a bike path that will be going past this intersection. The committee agrees to keep the light up until consulted with the bike path coordinator.
- 6.) The committee has been continuing to monitor the stop sign removal at Payne Avenue and Goundry Street. Member Frank has been gathering data from the speed sign every day which is showing that the average speed of the vehicles is well under the posted speed limit. This data has been sent to the Mayor's Office and Common Council, as is available upon request.



We switched the speed sign to the other side of the street to see the speeds in the southernly direction. We have been getting mostly positive feedback overall on this intersection although we have some residents in the neighborhood that would like the stop signs back up. One of these residents requested that the stop signs be taken down at Christiana Street instead of Goundry Street. There have been 2 accidents in which both drivers stopped at the stop sign and proceeded to fail to yield the right of way to the other vehicle. These drivers were issued tickets. Both drivers at fault said they did not read the sign that says, "Cross traffic does not stop", which is posted on both sides of Goundry Street. The committee will continue to monitor this intersection, as well as use the traffic officer, ADP Program and speed sign to help gather data.
