WHEREAS, in accordance with the New York state Environmental Quality Review regulations (SEQR), the City of North Tonawanda City Council conducted an environmental review of the proposed Oliver Street Walkability Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of North Tonawanda City Council has determined that the proposed action is a Type II Action as defined under SEQR and has prepared a Short Environmental Assessment Form.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the New York state Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations, the City of North Tonawanda has reviewed the Short Environmental Assessment Form (SEAF) Part 1 and Supplemental Information prepared by JM Davidson Engineering, DPC for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative Oliver Street Walkability & Implementation of Smart Growth Project ("Oliver Street Walkability Project") and determined that the project meets the criteria of 6 NYCRR ;Parts 617.5(c)(3) "retrofit of an existing structure and its appurtenant areas to incorporate green infrastructure" and 617.5(c)(2) "replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy, or fire codes unless such an action meets or exceeds the thresholds in Section 617.4 of this Part", thus meeting the requirements of a Type II Action and needing no further review under SEQR.

Traffic Safety Minutes:

The April meeting of the North Tonawanda Traffic Safety Committee was called to order at 1800 hours. Roll call showed the following members present: M. Meisenburg, R. Frank, N. Ferguson, M. Nalbone, N. Phelps and R. Brennan. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and accepted, the following new concerns/requests were discussed, and recommendations made.

1. Carlton Durham from 1416 East Robinson Rd. requested the right lane coming from the boulevard on the bridge going west bound on East Robinson be changed to right turn only. The reasoning is that on Robinson bridge there are two lanes and as you cross over Sweeney St. there is one lane. So, people tend to race side by side to get over one lane. As they do this, the cars come so close to the mailboxes and often knock them over. People are concerned about getting their mail because they don't want to get hit. The committee will continue to monitor this area to make a final decision.

- 2. Member Frank will be setting up the speed sign on Doebler. There were concerns of frequent vehicles speeding near 1292 Doebler.
- 3. Member Brennan had a request on Walck Rd. going West bound at Nash Rd. that the right lane should be right turn only. The reasoning is two lanes turn into one lane and drivers like to race to get ahead of each other before it turns into one lane as they drive through the intersection. The committee will continue to monitor this area to make a final decision.
- 4. After multiple accidents on Payne Ave. at the curve between Fredericka St. and Jackson the council is in favor of putting a guard rail along the curve. The pedestrian traffic is very high on that curve and the committee would hate to see any more injuries. As the chairman of the committee, I am looking into getting a quote on guard rail material. The DPW will be installing saving on labor costs.

The next Traffic Safety Meeting will be held on May 18th, 2025.
