# A LOCAL LAW TO ALLOW THE CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, NEW YORK TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPLE LAW SECTION 3-C

**WHEREAS,** on August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025, a public hearing was held at 6:15pm in the council chambers, 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York.

**WHEREAS,** General Municipal Law section 3-c requires Common Council to obtain sixty percent approval to adopt Local law #3 of 2025.

**WHEREAS**, that a Local Law to override the Tax Levy Limit for the City of North Tonawanda to be voted on, as follows:

MOVED by Alderman Marranca SECONDED by Alderman DiBernardo That the Common Council at a regular meeting, held at City Hall, 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York at 6:30 p.m. on August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2025 approves the Resolution for Local Law No.3 of 2025 -A Local Law of the City of North Tonawanda, New York to Override the Tax Levy Limit Established in General Municipal Law Section 3-C and it reads as follows:

# LOCAL LAW #3 OF 2025 A LOCAL LAW OF THE CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, NEW YORK TO OVERIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPLE LAW SECTION 3-C

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of North Tonawanda in the county of Niagara, as follows:

# Section 1. Legislative intent

It is the intent of the Local Law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the City of North Tonawanda, County of Niagara, State of New York pursuant to General Municipal Law 3-c, and to allow City of North Tonawanda to adopt a budget for (a) City purposes and (b) any other special or improvement district governed by the Common Council for the Fiscal Year 2026 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by the General Municipal Law 3-c.

# **Section 2. Authority**

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law 3-c, which expressly authorizes the Common Council to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the Common Council.

# Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override

The Common Council of the City of North Tonawanda is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2026 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law 3-c.

# Section 4. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of the Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgement shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of the Local Law or in its application to the person, individual,

firm, or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgement or order shall be rendered.

#### Section 5. Effective date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with Secretary of State.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THE EXTENT THAT THIS LOCAL LAW MAY CONFLICT WITH APLICABLE PORTIONS OF THE GENERAL CITY LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, IT IS STATED INTENTION OF THE CITY TO EXERCISE ITS AUTHORITY TO SUPERSEDE AND AMEND, AS GRANTED UNDER THE MUNICIPAL HOME RULE LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, SECTION 10. THE CITY HEREBY PROVIDES NOTICE THAT IT IS EXERCISING ITS AUTHORITY TO SUPERSEDE AND AMEND PURSANT TO MUNICIPAL HOME RULE LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK SECTION 22.5

The violation of §96-53 of this ordinance shall constitute a traffic infraction, and every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 15 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. For a second such conviction within 18 months thereafter, such persons shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$150 or by imprisonment for not more than 45 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within 18 months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

# Dear Honorable Body,

I have drafted an addition to our City Codes regarding enforcement of unregistered motor vehicles on public roadways and property. Currently, when officers come upon a vehicle parked on a public roadway, we are unable to enforce the violation because the Vehicle and Traffic Law states that the vehicle must be "in operation." We also have no City Code to address this violation. Captain Bush researched other municipalities and found that they have written this violation into their city ordinances.

I believe this to be a worthwhile addition to our City Codes, as it will allow officers to properly enforce this violation when they come upon it. I have submitted this to our City Attorney who reviewed it and approved it. Thank you for your consideration.

# §96-14.2 Restrictions Stated.

Vehicles must be properly registered. No person shall operate, drive or park a motor vehicle bearing a New York license plate or plates upon any of the streets, highways or public places of this City unless it is properly registered in accordance with the Vehicle and Traffic Laws of New York State.

# §96-14.3 Restrictions Stated.

No person shall operate, drive or park a motor vehicle upon any of the streets, highways or public places of this City unless a certificate or certificates of inspection, as required by New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, is or are displayed upon the vehicle or affixed to the registration certificate for the vehicle.

# §96-14.4 Removal of Vehicles.

The police may remove any vehicle operated, driven, or parked in violation of §96-14.2 above, may store the same, and the owner or operator of said vehicle shall be liable for the payment of reasonable charges for such removal and storage, in addition to any penalty imposed under §96-14.2 hereafter.

# §96-14.5 Violation and Penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not to exceed \$50 for the offense, and not to exceed \$100 for a second or subsequent offense, all of which were committed within a period of 18 months.

<u>Jack Kanak-84 South Meadow Drive</u>- Can our Future Water Bills have when our next Water Meter is going to be read? Because of the new Water Meter, that we don't have the meter cards anymore-it would be good to know when they are going to be read.

Mike Karen-775 Revere Ave.-When is the Police going to start policing the traffic on Nash and the area of Erie and Walck? I am very concerned about how people drive in the city. Question to the Mayor-Who oversees making the decision on what streets are going to be paved? He had a complaint about a large pothole on Walck-he believes it is a sinkhole. Also, he is very upset about the water & sewer charges on his recent bill. Would like the city to look into a summer meter to place on your hose, so he won't get charged sewer rates for watering his garden.

<u>Deb Cudzilo 625 Woodbury Drive-Expressed</u> her concerns about an incident that happened at The North Tonawanda Youth and Recreation Department involving a bullying incident with her two grandsons. She addressed many items to the Mayor on how the situation was handled and was disappointed. She was respectfully asking that the Mayor and the Director issue a public apology and please investigate how this incident happened. Also, she would like the city to look into reviewing their policies on running City run Facebook pages.

<u>Nancy Klepp 1295 Erie Ave.</u>- She also is concerned about how people drive in the city. She feels that Erie Avenue should be patrolled more for speeders. Also wanted to know if her request to put up a Deer Crossing sign on Erie had been addressed. She pointed out that there are more deer in the area than ever.

<u>Dan Cudzilo-71 Brentwood Drive</u>. -Addressed the council on the bullying incident at the Youth Center and was very disappointed in how the mayor's office had handled the situation.

<u>Kurt Klepp 1295 Erie Ave.</u>-Called the DPW twice about shrubbery he had put out to the curb for pick up, he was told that different Teams handle pick up differently. Asked the Mayor why is that? Also asked if we have a Street Cleaner, because he has made a tool that he uses to clean up the street in front of his house.
