THIS AGREEMENT, made this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 2025, by and between the CITY OF NORTH TONAWANDA, a Municipal Corporation in the State of New York, hereinafter referred to as the "First Party", and the NIAGARA COUNTY SPCA, located at 2100 LOCKPORT ROAD in the Town of Wheatfield, County of Niagara and State of New York, hereinafter referred to as the "Second Party".

### WITNESSETH

In consideration of the mutual promises herein contained for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The Second Party will give a key to the Dog Control Officer for the City of North Tonawanda to give said officer(s) access to the Shelter at all times where there will be cages, food and water available for the confinement of any domestic stray animal brought to the Shelter when no SPCA staff is available.
- 2. The Second Party will provide, maintain and operate a shelter for seized dogs and will provide facilities to humanely euthanize and make available for adoption in compliance with Article 7 of the NYS Agriculture and Markets Law.
- 3. The Second Party shall be open to the public Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 12noon to 6pm and Saturday 12 noon to 5pm. The Shelter will be closed to the public on Sundays, and on Tuesdays for adoptions, but open for owner redemptions. The Shelter will also be closed on designated holidays and special events when notice is given and during inclement weather.
- 4. The parties hereto agree to handle all emergency calls pertaining to injured stray, domestic animals or stray domestic animals in distress in the following manner: The City Dog Control Officer will deliver the sick or injured stray animals to the veterinarian of the Second Party during regular shelter hours. It shall be the responsibility of the Second Party to provide necessary medical treatment during shelter hours for an animal without an identifiable owner. If an owner is identified, the owner must pay all veterinary costs before the animal is returned.
- 5. The Second Party will file and maintain all records necessary, when applicable, for the seizure and disposition of any dog, as required by Article 7 of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law.
- 6. When applicable, the Second Party will hold seized dogs for the legal period specified in the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law. If during this period the owners wish to redeem their dog, they must obtain a New York State DL-18 dog release form from the Niagara County SPCA and take to the City of North Tonawanda Clerk's Office

- for completion, pay impound fees and license their dog. The Party of the Second Part will release the dog immediately upon their receipt of said release.
- 7. This contract shall be for a term of twelve (12) months, commencing on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 2025 and expiring on the 31st day of December 2025. The total contract price for the duration of the contract is \$7,200.00. Payments shall be made on the first day of each month during the term of the contract in the amount of \$600.00 per month.
- 8. Thereafter, the contract will renew on a month-to-month basis at the current contract price unless either party gives a 30-day written notice of its intent to change the price or its intent not to renew.
- 9. The Second Party shall provide all services heretofore agreed with reasonable care and diligence.
- 10. Any modification, addition or addendum to this agreement shall be in writing and executed by both the First Party and the Second Party in order to be enforceable.
- 11. Either party may, for any reason, cancel the 1(one) year agreement, provided that written notice is given sixty (60) days prior to cancellation.

# Memorandum of Agreement Between City of North Tonawanda And Civil Service Employees Association, Inc. Local 1000, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Local 832 City of North Tonawanda Unit # 7692

THIS UNDERSTANDING, by and between the City of North Tonawanda (hereinafter, "City") and the Civil Service Employees Association, Local 1000, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Local 832 Unit 7692 (hereinafter, "CSEA") and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City and CSEA are parties to a collective bargaining agreement (hereinafter, "CBA") covering the period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2028 and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants contained herein, it is understood and agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. The City agrees to expand residency by allowing all full time CSEA employees to live in the following areas: City of Tonawanda, Town of Tonawanda, Amherst, Niagara Falls, Kenmore, Niagara Wheatfield, Cambria, Pendleton and Sanborn.
- 2. The City and CSEA agree to change the following language in the contract regarding Section 12.13:
  - 12.13 Medical insurance for Retirees pursuant to the following plan:

The Employer shall provide medical insurance coverage for Retirees at the group rate, and by payment of a percentage of the premiums, pursuant to the schedule below. The balance of said premiums will be paid by the Retiree to the Employer. The Employer will provide said coverage until age seventy-two (72) or otherwise terminated or pre-empted by other coverage through Medicare, Medicaid or a spouse plan. However, in the event the spouse's insurance would expire or no longer be effective, then the retiree medical coverage provided hereunder for a retired member can be picked up by the retired member or retired member's spouse with the Employer paying their percentage of the premium as set forth in this Section. The number of sick days at retirement shall determine the percentage of premiums paid by the City as indicated in the schedule below.

For employees hired prior to August 1, 1986:

At age sixty-five (65), when a retiree is eligible for Medicare or if retiree qualifies for Medicare prior to age sixty-five (65) due to a disability, the Employer will provide coverage to retiree and spouse until each turn the age of seventy-two (72), as indicated in the schedule below. If a retiree is eligible for Medicare and spouse is not, the spouse will remain on the Employer's plan until the spouse becomes eligible for Medicare with the Employer continuing to pay according to the schedule listed below. If the retiree dies, the spouse will continue to be covered until the age of seventy-two (72).

If said plan becomes unavailable in the future, the Employer will offer retirees the health plan agreed upon by both parties.

If the Employer is able to obtain equivalent or better coverage with an equivalent or better actuarial value, which demonstrates overall cost savings from the current plan offerings through another health insurance carrier, the Employer shall have the right to substitute carriers, provided that the Employer first obtains approval from a joint Health Insurance Committee. The Committee shall include a CSEA Unit representative (selected by the CSEA Unit President) and up to two (2) staff representatives from the Union (selected by the CSEA Unit President). The Employer agrees to provide no less than ninety (90) thirty (30) days' notice of any recommended substitution to the Union to review and analyze the potential change. Agreed to changes may be adopted at any time during the term of this Collective Bargaining Agreement after mutual agreement of the CSEA and the Employer and subsequent ratification by the CSEA membership and the Board.

Should the Employer offer more than one (1) plan for retirees, the retiree can select which plan he/she will enroll. Any differences in rates between these plans will be negotiated by CSEA and the City.

Regardless of the above formula, if an employee suffers an unforeseen catastrophic illness, injury or requires surgery within one (1) year of the employee's retirement and the employee has a record of not abusing sick days, the above formula requirement will be waived for that event only and said sick days will not be deducted from the sick days needed to qualify for the certain percentages of insurance as set out above. Pre-existing illness and injury or surgery occurs within one (1) year of the employee's retirement. An Administrative Committee made up of the Employer's Collective Negotiating Chairman, the City Attorney and a union representative will determine eligibility for this waiver. In determining this waiver, the Committee can expressly take into account the employee's work record as far as attendance for the previous three (3) years and is expressly entitled to take into account any absences for the use of sick leave time; although, other factors may be considered by the Administrative Committee in making its determination.

Employees retiring under this Agreement will be eligible for coverage as is presently maintained by the Employer and any additions, deletions, modifications to coverage made by the Employer in future contracts will automatically apply to persons retiring under this Agreement.



Dear Honorable Body;

As you are aware, the City issued a Request for Development Proposals (RFP) for 78 Bridge Street, the city-owned former fire training site on Tonawanda Island, on May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. The city received 3 proposals by the July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 deadline. A review committee representing the Community Development Office, Engineering Office, Mayor's Office, Common Council, Lumber City Development Corporation, and Niagara County Brownfields Program was formed to review the proposals and conduct interviews with each developer.

All 3 proposals were submitted by well qualified development teams. Following a lengthy review, the review committee unanimously selected Visone Co. Site Development, LLC's "Bridge Street Landing" proposal.

Visone Co. Site Development, LLC is a Clarence-based developer, a full-service general construction firm, and property management company. The enterprise manages over 300,000 square feet of residential, commercial, retail, and light manufacturing real estate in Western New York. They have also successfully constructed over \$225 Million of municipal, industrial, residential, and commercial construction projects.

Visone Co.'s "Bridge Street Landing" project is a proposed 3-story 100,430 square foot mixed-use development which will include 73 market rate apartment units, 7 vacation rental/residence hotel units, and a waterfront commercial space ideal for a coffee shop/café type of tenant along the Little River waterfront. The unit mix will include predominately 1- and 2-bedroom units, with a few studios and 3-bedroom units. Additionally, the project includes a public access riverwalk and public benefit area. This project will be the first step to establish residential density on Tonawanda Island, and a unique design approach that will set a high standard for future Tonawanda Island development projects. Please see enclosed for additional information on the Bridge Street Landing project.

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The estimated total project cost is \$21,882,600 and Visone Co. Site Development is offering a purchase price for the property of \$400,900.

If selected by this Honorable Body, Visone Co. Site Development will have 60 days to execute a Land Disposition Agreement (LDA) with the City and 18 months from the execution of the LDA to secure financing and all required site plan and building approvals. Upon completion of these tasks, Visone Co. Site Development will have 6 months to begin construction and 24 months to complete the project.

On behalf of the selection committee, I respectfully request this Honorable Body select and designate Visone Co. Site Development, LLC as preferred developer for 78 Bridge Street, direct the City Attorney to draft a Land Disposition Agreement in accordance with the outline set forth in the original RFP, and authorize the Mayor to execute the Land Disposition Agreement with Visone Co. Site Development, LLC.
