

CHAPTER XXX ENERGY RESTRICTIONS AND NUCLEAR FREE ZONE

§ XXX-1 Definitions

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

HAZARDOUS RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL

Any radioactive isotope(s) resulting from the operation of nuclear fission reactors; the elements of spent nuclear fission reactor fuel that are themselves radioactive; the radioactive components of nuclear fission reactors, or of any device or component of a device that has been used to contain or process radioactive isotopes; or the tailing or similar debris resulting from the mining of uranium or other radioactive elements, except as specifically exempted herein.

NUCLEAR REACTOR

Any device that has as its purpose the controlled release of energy from nonexplosive reactions involving the fission of atomic nuclei.

MICROREACTOR

Nuclear microreactors are very small reactors usually generating less than 50 megawatts electric (MWe). They are seen as an alternative to small modular (50-300 MWe) or conventional reactors (often around 1,000 MWe). By comparison, microreactors can be produced more quickly, and within weeks, transported and deployed to locations such as isolated military bases or communities affected by natural disasters. They are designed to provide resilient, non-carbon emitting, and independent power in those environments.

SMALL MODULAR REACTOR (SMR)

The small modular reactor (SMR) is a class of small nuclear fission reactor, designed to be built in a factory, shipped to operational sites for installation and then used to power buildings or other commercial operations. The term SMR refers to the size, capacity and modular construction. Reactor type and the nuclear processes may vary. Of the many SMR designs, the pressurized water reactor (PWR) (a type of light water nuclear reactor) is the most common. However, recently proposed SMR

designs include generation IV, thermal-neutron reactors, fast-neutron reactors, molten salt, and gascooled reactor models.

PERSONS

Any person, corporation, college or university, laboratory, institution, governmental agency or other entity.

WIND TURBINES

Devices that convert the wind's kinetic energy into electrical energy through the use of rotating blades connected to a generator. This includes both onshore and offshore installations.

NATURAL GAS ENERGY PLANTS

Facilities that generate electricity by burning natural gas to power turbines, often used as a cleaner alternative to coal or oil-based plants.

COAL ENERGY PLANTS

Facilities that generate electricity by burning coal to produce steam, which powers turbines connected to electrical generators.

HYDROELECTRIC ENERGY FACILITIES

Installations that produce electricity by harnessing the energy of flowing or falling water, typically through dams or other water control systems.

XXX-2 Prohibition of hazardous radioactive material work

No person shall knowingly engage in work involving hazardous radioactive materials within the City of North Tonawanda as of the effective date of this chapter. Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit any person from engaging in such work outside of the City of North Tonawanda.

XXX-3 Transportation

Any transportation of hazardous radioactive materials through or over the City of North Tonawanda shall be subject to the following restrictions:

- A. Any person transporting such material shall notify the City of North Tonawanda at least 45 days prior to such transportation for review under provisions of this section, specifying the nature of such material, precise schedules of transport, and means of transport.
- B. Any person required to notify the City of North Tonawanda, as provided for in Subsection A above, shall, after notice is provided to the City of North Tonawanda, inform the public by a legal notice in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of North Tonawanda no less than one day per week for the four consecutive weeks preceding such transportation through the City of North Tonawanda. The published legal notice shall specify the nature of such material, precise schedules of transport, means of transport, and routes of transport and shall invite public responses, if any.

- C. The City of North Tonawanda shall independently monitor the transport of hazardous radioactive material through or over the City of North Tonawanda and shall assess the adequacy of safety and notice provisions relating thereto.
- D. Each vehicle involved in such transport shall have clearly visible signs meeting, at a minimum, state and federal requirements for identifying its contents as hazardous nuclear material.

XXX-4 Prohibition of reprocessing, storage, and use

No person shall reprocess, store, dump, or use hazardous radioactive materials for any purpose within the City of North Tonawanda.

XXX-5 Nuclear-free purchases and investments

- A. The City of North Tonawanda shall not purchase or lease any goods or services produced or provided by companies involved in the production of hazardous radioactive materials unless the Common Council makes a specific determination that no reasonable alternative exists.
- B. Any bidder for the City of North Tonawanda's purchases or leases of goods or services must certify by affidavit whether it or any of its subsidiaries or its parent company are involved in such activities.
- C. The City of North Tonawanda shall not invest in any company engaged in the production of hazardous radioactive materials.

XXX-6 Energy Source Restrictions

- A. No person shall operate or cause to be built a nuclear reactor, as defined in § XXX-1, within the City of North Tonawanda.
- B. No person shall construct, install, or operate new wind turbines within the City of North Tonawanda.
- C. No person shall construct, install, or operate new natural gas energy plants within the City of North Tonawanda.
- D. No person shall construct, install, or operate new coal energy plants within the City of North Tonawanda.
- E. No person shall construct, install, or operate new hydroelectric energy facilities within the City of North Tonawanda.

XXX-7 Enforcement, sanctions, and citizens' rights

- A. The Climate Smart Task Force of the City of North Tonawanda shall have the duty to hold hearings, issue reports, and make recommendations to the Common Council, as it deems appropriate, to educate the public, determine means of implementation, and evaluate compliance with all sections of this chapter.
- B. The City of North Tonawanda, or any resident thereof, has the right to enforce this chapter by appropriate civil action for declaratory or injunctive relief. A prevailing plaintiff shall be

- awarded reasonable costs of suit and attorneys' fees, payable by the person found to have violated this chapter.
- C. Each violation of this chapter shall be a misdemeanor, and each day shall be deemed a separate violation.
- D. Where the City of North Tonawanda determines that any energy activity covered under this chapter is occurring in North Tonawanda inconsistent with the intentions of this chapter, the city shall so notify the person(s) with a formal order to cease and desist from such activities. Each person so notified may appeal this decision to the Common Council within 30 days of receipt of said notice. The Common Council may uphold an appeal only if it finds, after public hearing, that such person is not engaged in prohibited energy activities or other activity inconsistent with this chapter within the City of North Tonawanda. Failure of any person to comply with a cease-and-desist order within 60 days following its receipt, or following an unsuccessful appeal, shall be prosecuted to the full extent of city police powers. In addition, the city may impose either or both of the following sanctions:
 - a. Cut off any or all city services to the person concerned; and
 - b. Levying of fines.

XXX-8 Exclusions

A. Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit the use of radioactive materials for medical, educational, or scientific purposes as determined by the City.

XXX-9 When effective

- A. Unless otherwise specified, the provisions of this chapter are effective immediately.
- B. No person shall, within the City of North Tonawanda, commence any such prohibited activities after the date of passage of this chapter.

Dear Mayor Tylec and Members of the Common Council,

As Clerk/Treasurer for the City of North Tonawanda, I am writing to present a recommendation for an adjustment to the rental rates for the upcoming season. This proposed increase aims to support the city's operational needs while remaining fair and reasonable for our valued permit holders.

After careful review and consideration, we recommend the following adjustments to the rental rates:

- Full-Year Permit: Increase from \$400 to \$450
- Seasonal Permit: Increase from \$275 to \$325

Additionally, we propose changing the seasonal time frame from April 1st to the end of October instead of September. We have observed that consumers perceive the season as winding down in September, leading to a decline in traffic. Extending the season through October will encourage vendors to remain longer, maximizing foot traffic and sales during this period.

This adjustment reflects a modest increase in rates, which has not been updated in several years and proposed rates are consistent with other markets. By implementing these changes, the city anticipates an additional revenue of approximately \$4,000. This additional funding will contribute to the ongoing maintenance and improvements of our facilities, ensuring a high standard of service for our residents and visitors.

We believe these changes are both necessary and equitable, striking a balance between fiscal responsibility and community affordability.

NORTH TONAWANDA COMMON COUNCIL RESOLUTION PERMITTING AND APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF THE NORTH TONAWANDA BOTANICAL GARDENS ORGANIZATION IN APPLYING FOR A PROJECT GRANT FROM THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION UNDER THE ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE COMMUNITY EDUCATION CENTERS GRANT

WHEREAS, the North Tonawanda Botanical Gardens Organization, Inc is applying to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for a project grant under the Environmental Justice Community Environmental Education Centers Grant, (specifically, NYS SFS Grant Management Bid Event ID No: EJCEEC R 1); and

WHEREAS, the location where the funds of the project grant would be utilized are at 1825 Sweeney Street, North Tonawanda, New York 14120, a site located within the territorial jurisdiction of this Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the plans of the North Tonawanda Botanical Gardens will implement the support of either new construction or a renovation of a facility to create a community environmental education center that inspires the exploration, discovery, and learning about the community's environment; and

WHEREAS, the North Tonawanda Botanical Gardens has provided documentation of complying with § 139 of the New York State Finance Law, Executive Order 16, and that the proposed project is consistent with the State Smart Growth Public Infrastructure criteria; and

WHEREAS, the North Tonawanda Botanical Gardens has shown proof of the following; (1) an annual operating budget of under \$5,000,000; (2) they are a not-for-profit and an independent governed body; (3) their primary office is within New York State, (4) their charter cannot be revoked; (5) their Statewide financial system (SFS) registration and prequalification; and the project location is in an Environmental Justice area; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the City of North Tonawanda, state of New York, does hereby approve and endorse the application of the North Tonawanda Botanical Gardens Organization for a grant in the amount \$3,000,000, the maximum allowed funds under the Community Environmental Education Centers NYS SFS Grants Management Bid Event ID No.: EJCEEC R 1 for a project known as the North Tonawanda Environmental Education Center; and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk, no later than 30 days after passage of this Resolution, shall transmit copies of this resolution to (1) the Mayor of North Tonawanda, (2) all members of the North Tonawanda Common Council, and (3) the City Attorney's Office.
