



Based on information submitted by the applicant including a Short Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) - Part I, (as amended) and a complete site plan application, a preliminary staff analysis was undertaken. Compared to the criteria listed in Section 617.7, The Lead Agency has determined that the proposed action will not have a significant impact on the environment, as follows:

Reasons Supporting This Determination:

Impact on Land

The project is not expected to cause a substantial adverse change in existing air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, or noise levels; a substantial increase in solid waste production; or a substantial increase in the potential for erosion, flooding, leaching or drainage problems based on grading, drainage and utility plans submitted with the application and reviewed by the City Engineering Department.

Impact on Plants and Animals

The project will not result in the removal or destruction of large quantities of vegetation or fauna, or significant adverse impacts to fish, wildlife species, habitats or other natural resources.

Consistency with Community Plans

The project is not expected to create any substantive conflict with the City Comprehensive Plan. The Planning Commission, in their review of the project, determined that the subject project has or will have met all Zoning Ordinance regulations.

Consistency with Community Character

The project will not impair the character or quality of important aesthetic resources or of existing community or neighborhood character. The property is zoned R 2 (General

Residence District) and consistent with surrounding land use. The site has been used as a community facility since the existing pool was constructed in 1947.

Impact on Historic and Archeological Resources

The Memorial Pool was built in 1947 as a memorial to World War II Veterans. This unique above ground structure is on the New York State Historic Preservation Office's list as potentially eligible for the National Register. The project currently is not within an area identified by the State as potentially containing significant cultural or archeological resources, nor will it impair the character or quality of important historical resources. The Payne Park Memorial Pool will remain, and no impacts are proposed.

Impact on Energy

The proposed aquatic facility will include construction of an activity pool, splash pad, slide, lap pool with deep end for diving, grass and landscaped areas, parking lot for 55 cars, storm drainage and site grading, which will not cause a major change in the use of either the quantity or type of energy.

Impact on Human Health

The project will not create any hazard to human health.

Issues not specifically mentioned above and/or those not specifically reviewed were not raised by City departments, outside agencies or the public and are not determined to cause significant negative environmental impacts.
